Below is a list of our preferred certificates that we use.



STANDARD 100 BY OEKO-TEX®

STANDARD 100 by OEKO-TEX® is a global standardized product certificate as well as a health mark. Through impartial tests the standard ensures that certified goods do not contain any harmful substances.

STANDARD 100 by OEKO-TEX® is not equal to an ecology marking. The label is the consumer's guarantee that textile products comply with certain limits for content of harmful substances, as well as substances suspected of being harmful to health.



FSC – FOREST STEWARDSHIP COUNCIL

FSC is an international non-profit organisation dedicated to promoting responsible forestry. FSC runs a global forest certification system with two key components: Forest management and chain of custody. The system allows consumers to identify wood, paper and other forest products produced from well-managed forests and/or recycled materials.



BSCI – BUSINESS SOCIAL COMPLIANCE INITIATIVE

The BSCI is a leading supply chain management system that supports companies in driving social compliance and improvements within the factories and farms in their global supply chains.

BSCI implements the principle international labour standards protecting workers' rights such as International Labour Organization (ILO) conventions and declarations, the United Nations (UN) Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights and guidelines for multinational enterprises of the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD).



GOTS – GLOBAL ORGANIC TEXTILE STANDARD

GOTS is the worldwide leading standard for organic fibres, and covers the entire production chain, from field to finished product.

GOTS covers processing, manufacturing, packaging, labelling, trading and distribution of all textiles made from at least 70 per cent certified organic natural fibres.

The standard includes both social and environmental criteria, by ensuring regulated working conditions for all workers in the process, treatment of wastewater, strictly regulated use of chemicals, quality requirements for product, etc.



BCI – BETTER COTTON INITIATIVE

BCI exists to make global cotton production better for the people who produce cotton, better for the environment and better for the sector's future, by developing Better Cotton as a sustainable mainstream commodity.

The Better Cotton Standard System is a holistic approach to sustainable cotton production, which covers all three pillars of sustainability: Environmental, social and economic.

Better Cotton farmers produce cotton in a way that is measurably better for the environment and farming communities.



SEDEX, THE SUPPLIER ETHICAL DATA EXCHANGE

SEDEX, is a not-for-profit organisation based in London, UK.

Sedex is a membership organisation for business committed to continuous improvement of the ethical performance of their supply chains.

Sedex enables member companies to efficiently manage the ethical and responsible practices of their global supply chains, generating transparency through the provision of a data exchange.



OCS, THE ORGANIC CONTENT STANDARD

OCS applies to any non-food product containing 95-100 percent organic material.

It verifies the presence and amount of organic material in a final product and tracks the flow of the raw material from its source to final product.

The Woolmark brand is the world's best known textile quality fibre brand. The value of the brand is well established and highly regarded across the world. The woolmark logo is a certification trademark and products that carry it must be tested at independent authorised laboratories and approved by the Woolmark Company.

GRS – GLOBAL RECYCLE STANDARD

The Global Recycle Standard (GRS) documents the recycled content in a product.

This standard certifies that all production processes in the entire supply chain have undergone the proper steps to ensure the integrity of the final product.

GRS uses a transaction certificate system that allows for optimal tracking of recycled materials, while also addressing issues related to environmental and social criteria. This acts as a monitoring and controlling mechanism throughout the value chain of certified final products.
